

RESOLUTION NO. RS-2016-30

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE DISPOSAL OF OBSOLETE 1990S PHOENIX RESCUE EQUIPMENT TO THE ARKANSAS FIREHOUSE HOSTEL AND MUSEUM OF LITTLE ROCK, AR.

WHEREAS, Municipal Code § 2-119 authorizes the sale or exchange of city property without competitive bidding if the mayor "certify[ies] in writing to the city council in his opinion, the fair market value of such items or lot (to be disposed of as one unit) does not exceed the sum of five thousand dollars (\$5,000.00);" and

WHEREAS, the mayor on July 19, 2016 signed Mayoral Directive 2015-24 certifying his opinion that three items of 1990s Phoenix Rescue Equipment, has no market value and authorizing the disposal of the same without competitive bidding; and

WHEREAS, the mayor has expressed that the Arkansas Firehouse Hostel and Museum of Little Rock, AR has expressed an interest acquiring said items; and

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of Monticello, Arkansas, that the City of Monticello is authorized and directed to dispose of said 1990s Phoenix Rescue Equipment, to the Arkansas Firehouse Hostel and Museum of Little Rock, AR.



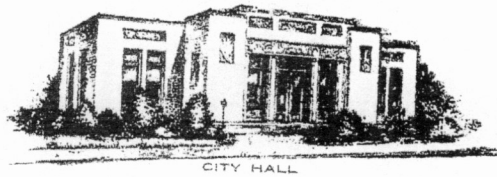

AUTHORIZING THE DISPOSAL OF THREE ITEMS OF 1990S PHOENIX RESCUE EQUIPMENT

July 19, 2016

INTRODUCTION

Municipal Code § 2-119 authorizes the sale or exchange of city property without competitive bidding if the mayor "certify[ies] in writing to the city council in his opinion, the fair market value of such items or lot (to be disposed of as one unit) does not exceed the sum of five thousand dollars (\$5,000.00).


Phoenix Rescue Equipment estimates the value of the three items of its 1990s rescue equipment to have no cash value.

DIRECTIVE

- 1 In compliance with Municipal Code § 2-119, I hereby certify in my opinion the fair market
- 2 value of three items of its 1990s Phoenix Rescue Equipment, is \$0.00 and therefore authorize the
- 3 disposal of said vehicle to the Arkansas Firehouse Hostel and Museum of Little Rock, AR, per
- 4 approval the City Council of Monticello, Arkansas.

This Mayoral Directive will take effect immediately and will remain in place until rescinded by future written mayoral communication or enactment of relevant Municipal Code, State Statute, or Federal Laws.
